Old Business:

Timing for the final presentation to the BOS of the Clinton Greenway project was discussed and the group agreed to time it with possible press releases of the Clinton Green/Blueway. Carrie will look into the press options before the March BPAC meeting and the date will be finalized then. Hal and Carrie will work on the final presentation together this week then the committee will make the final touches on the presentation during the March meeting.

Carrie discussed her attendance at the annual town meeting of committees/boards/commissions in late January and her realization that BPAC had not handled meetings well since former chairperson Debbie Lundgren had left town. Mistakes were discussed and a more 'legal' future for BPAC planned.

Hal brought up the Morgan to Morgan sidewalk which has been a BPAC concern since the new high school was only in the discussion stage. That concern is now a town project and we feel confident it will be completed by the powers that be.

The Cream Pot bridge project is still scheduled to begin the building phase in April of this year.

New Business:

The Route 81 Corridor Study will soon be holding meetings and BPAC will be included in those meetings.

Hal made a motion, seconded by Maureen, to adjourn, and the meeting was closed at 7:35.
