5. Report of Student Representatives

The Student Representatives to the Board reported on events at each of the schools. The Morgan School's *Dodge for a Difference* raised over \$2,000 for families in need. Students are finding creative ways to thank teachers during Teacher Appreciation Week. Class nominations for student government are taking place in May as are senior and junior proms, field trips, sports night, spirit week, and spring sports.

At Jared Eliot School, Pasta Night will be held on May 12. Annie Jr. was a success. Field trips to Mystic and Holiday Hill will be taking place at the end of the month. Eighth grade elections are taking place as is Spirit Day on May 5. The Invention Convention was a success and students thanked E. Gelven for attending their presentations. The Social Justice Club is collecting supplies for students who are English language learners.

At Joel, Friends of Joel sponsored the *Husky Hop*. An end-of-year sing-along is taking place in May as is an ice cream social.

6.Administrative Reports

A.Administrators, Program Directors and Teachers

1.Middle School ASPIRE Presentation

Eliot Principal Kristin LaLima introduced Eliot teachers, Laura Pierandi and Emily Kelsey, and two student representatives, Jacquelyn Ciarleglio and Sophia Martin, provided the Board with an overview of the ASPIRE program at Eliot. The students shared their experiences and one of their culminating projects. The students were applauded for their work.

B.Assistant Superintendent's Report

1.General Update

M. Famiglietti noted that prelimary SAT scores have been received. Preliminary results indicate an increase in math performance for the fourth year in a row. In LAS Links, an English Language Learner (ELL) proficiency test, 20 out of 128 students districtwide tested well enough to exit the ELL program, although they will continue to receive services through the end of the school year.

Advance Placement testing is ongoing at the high school and Smarter Balanced testing for grades three through eight will take place for two weeks starting May 4. On May 12, teachers districtwide will participate in professional development. At the state level, an open review period for literacy curriculua and programs has commenced and will lead to a list of state-endorsed programs by July 1, 2022. The district will look at implementing what the state recommends. On May 10, a representative/trainer from Goodwin University's *Ecamp* engineering program will provide operation and curriculum training on the new machinery at the high school. An open house is scheduled for June 7 which will showcase Morgan's new advanced manufacturing equipment. J. Adler followed up with a question regarding the literacy curriculum publishing dates.

C. Business Manager's Report

1.Bills Payable

There were no questions regarding bills payable. A suggestion was made to raise the threshhold on a report that currently lists items over \$2,000.

2. Quarterly Expenditure & Revenue Reports

C. Dickey provided an overview of the Q3 summary expenditures and revenue. Questions followed regarding ECS funding levels and the process for handling gate receipts from athletic events.

3. Health Insurance Renewal Update

C. Dickey updated the Board regarding the increase in health insurance renewal rates through the CT State Partnership Plan. The increase is almost 5% higher than anticipated/budgeted. The account will likely show a negative balance next year, but C. Dickey expressed hope that savings from the current year combined with a decrease in the number of employees enrolled in the plan will offset the increase.

4. Food Service Financials Update

The Food Services Department's financials are doing well due to reimbursements and grants from the state. C. Dickey praised Food Services Director Jon Siciliano for his efforts this year. Her department will make a presentation to the Buildings & Grounds subcommittee regarding the carryover of funds. Currently proposed projects include creation of a new food service line and installation of a new sink at Eliot to remediate a minor building code violation.

5. General Update

Requests for proposals have been posted on the district website and in area newspapers for two building projects: lavatory sink replacement and playground fencing.

7. Superintendent's Report

A.2022-23 Budget Update

The annual town meeting will be held on May 4 where the Board's 2022-23 budget is up for referendum. An overall increase of 1.73% in the Board of Education's Budget is being presented, which includes an increase of 1.89% to the Board's Operating budget. The mill rate increase for Clinton taxpayers would be zero.

B.Strategic Planning Timeline & Update

Strategic planning group input sessions with staff are ongoing. M. O'Donnell will be forwarding a three-question survey to Board members and parents to gather final input. Results will be presented to the Board in August. A parent forum on Strategic Planning will be held on May 24. In June, the Board of Education will hold a Special meeting on strategic planning.

C.General Update

End-of-year events are taking place as preparations are being made to close the schools for the summer. Teachers and staff are being celebrated during Teacher Appreciation Week, May 2 through May 6.
