Supplemental Motor vehicle assessments may be appealed to the Board of Assessment Appeals during the month of March (C.G.S. 12-110). Appointments are necessary. The meeting dates will be published in an area newspaper, posted to the Town's website www.clintonct.org or you can call the Assessor's Office). The prescribed appeal form must be completed in order to appear before the Board of Assessment Appeals. (See Attached) Complete all sections of the Appeal Form as indicated. If someone else is representing you as your agent, a completed "Affidavit for Agent" is available in the Assessor's office. In April you will be notified by mail of the Board's decision. If not satisfied with the Board's decision, you may, within two months of that decision file an appeal with the Connecticut Superior Court (C.G.S. 12-12-117a) where it is highly recommended that you have legal counsel.
