

Town Manager's Corner

PIERSON SCHOOL UPDATE

There is a great deal to discuss about the future of the former Abraham Pierson School. As a school, the building has been a focus on civic life for many who either attended, or their children attended, the Pierson School. Others may have enjoyed community events held on the site such as summer concerts hosted in the gazebo or more recent arts activities.

Earlier this year, the Town sought a development partner to bring new life to the Pierson School building. The Town Council decided that the school should find a new life providing housing for senior citizens in Clinton. The development goals for the property included adaptive re-use of the school for housing as well as maintaining some aspects of civic life in and around the property. Specifically, the Town wants to maintain the gazebo and statues to as a park and venue for town events. Developers were also challenged to be creative in working with the Town to allow for community use inside the building if it was economically feasible.

Schools are often redeveloped as housing with senior housing being more common. Former school buildings provide ready-made apartment sizes with the existing classroom sizes and are often one bedroom units. One bedroom apartments

usually support senior citizens. In the case of Pierson, the goal is also to provide apartments at an affordable rent for those on a fixed income.

In response to the Town's Request for Development Proposals, three firms stepped forward with their vision for how the building could be redeveloped and a possible partnership with the Town for community uses. At present, those proposals are being evaluated for their benefits to the Town and approach to the project. Eventually, the list of proposals will be narrowed and a public presentation will be given to the Town Council in advance of a final decision on moving forward.

When the project is ready to advance, a decision will be required at a Special Town Meeting to finally approve the real estate part of the transaction which will allow the developer to start their work. The start of their work however will not be construction. The development team will be focused on completing their due diligence on the site and locking up

the source of financing which will allow for the school to be re-purposed for housing. State and federal financing tools will provide most of the lift to pay for redeveloping the school. Construction would follow financing approvals and land use approvals from the Town.

It is our hope that we have a development partner that can work well with the Town, provide an important housing need for part of the community, and help bring new life to Main Street with new activity in the former Pierson School.

There will be much more to watch on this project as it moves forward.

Tax Collector

Taxes Due Again January 1, 2023

- **The second installment of town tax** for real estate and personal property taxes will be due on January 1, 2023, last day to pay without penalty February 1, 2023. Of course you can pay anytime between now and Feb 1, 2023.
- **Supplemental motor vehicle taxes** will be due January 1, 2023 by any person who owns a motor vehicle, which was registered after the first day of October 2021 and registered before the first day of August 2022 in the town where such vehicle is subject to property tax.
- **Interest accrues at 1.5% per month** from the due date, 18% per annum.
- **Please take care in how you send us your tax payments.** We have had many taxpayers who use the US Postal Service suffer from fraud. Please consider using your banks electronic banking to send payments, or use the online portal.

We do accept credit card, debit card and electronic check payments online. We cannot process credit or debits cards in the office at this time. Go to www.clintonct.org. Click on the Tax Payment Icon. There is a \$.95 processing fee when paying by electronic check and a 2.99% processing fee for using a debit or credit card.

MOTOR VEHICLE INFORMATION

Motor Vehicle assessments are based upon 70% of average retail value as determined by the Assessor. Having said that with a shortage of cars and car

parts, (especially the necessary computer chips, due to many factors including Covid-19, inflation and increase of the cost of new cars) statewide we have seen an average increase in vehicle values by 26%

NOVEMBER 7, 2023 MUNICIPAL ELECTION

Absentee Ballot applications are available in the Town Clerk's Office and on the Town Clerk's website, click on Elections. If you are leaving for college or elsewhere and will not be in Clinton for the election, you may apply for an absentee ballot which will be mailed to you on Friday, October 6, 2023. Applications can be downloaded from the Secretary of the State's website at: www.sots.gov or on the town website at: www.clintonct.org and then mail or drop off the completed application to Town Clerk, 54 East Main Street, Clinton, CT 06413.

AB ballots become available October 6, 2023.

The State of Connecticut has a portal for requesting an absentee ballot. The website is: www.myvote.ct.gov/getmyab. Anyone eligible to vote, with a Connecticut driver's license can go online and complete the application for an absentee ballot and click submit. We will receive the application the next day for processing.

Last day to register to vote is October 31, 2023. If you miss

the deadline, you can appear at the polls for Election Day Registration.

PERMANENT ABSENTEE BALLOTS

Public Act #11-173: An elector can file an Absentee Ballot application together with a doctor's certificate (presumably on letter head,) stating that they have a permanent disability and are unable to appear in person at their polling place. This will allow an elector to be on our Permanent Absentee ballot list. AB ballots will then be automatically mailed to the elector for the Election.





When we are grieving the loss of a close family member, it can be challenging to concentrate, let alone fill out paperwork for the funeral home, life insurance company or the probate court. To help be prepared for this challenge, it is important to know what the law is surrounding probate requirements, as well as the utility of following correct probate procedure, even if all estate assets are jointly held, in order to avoid negative downstream consequences.

FIRST

Connecticut law requires that the person in possession of the original will of a deceased person must deliver the will either to: (1) the person designated to be the executor, or (2) the Probate Court. If the will is delivered to the Probate Court, it should be delivered to the Probate Court where the deceased person last resided with an intent to stay (referred to as their domicile). If the person was domiciled in Chester, Clinton,

The Probate Court and You

Do I Need Probate if All of the Estate Assets are Jointly Held?

Deep River, Essex, Haddam, Killingworth, Lyme, Old Saybrook or Westbrook, the will should be delivered to the Saybrook Probate Court located on the second floor of the Old Saybrook Town Hall at 302 Main Street in Old Saybrook. Sometimes people wonder what happens with these wills – it can be hard to let them go. We store these original wills in perpetuity, first in our office, then in the Town Clerk's vault at the Old Saybrook Town Hall, and eventually at either the State Library (wills executed in 1976 or earlier) or at Meyer Records Management.

SECOND

Connecticut law also requires each person in actual or constructive possession of any property of the deceased person to file a Form CT 706 NT (a Connecticut Estate Tax Return for Nontaxable Estates) with the Probate Court. The Form CT 706 NT must be filed for each deceased person who, at the time of death was a Connecticut resident, within six (6) months after their date of death. When all assets are held jointly between spouses, filing the Form CT-706 NT may seem like an unwelcome, extra task at an already challenging time. If more time is needed, a request for an extension of time should be made with the Probate Court.

The request will be automatically granted as long as it is filed before the due date of the Form CT-706 NT (6 months after death). If spouses jointly own a home, it is very important that the Form CT-706 NT is filed, and lists the home. The reason why the home must be listed on the Form CT-706 NT even if it is owned jointly by spouses, is because a release of estate tax and probate fee liens from the Probate Court is needed in order to clear title to the home so it can later be sold. If the release is not obtained soon after the first spouse dies, it will still need to be obtained before the house can be sold, and can cause unwelcome delay at the time of the real estate closing.

Fortunately, if all assets of the deceased person are owned jointly or pass by a beneficiary designation, an abbreviated process (called a "tax purposes only estate") allows probate to be completed quickly, often in several months' time.
