## Town Manager's Corner

### New Opportunities

Welcome to the start of a new year and the sense of hope and renewal that comes with the change of a calendar as well as a list of resolutions to work on.

Transitions on the Town Council brought new individuals to the Town's governing board. In our chosen form of government, the Town Council enjoys all the importance of a Board of Directors (legislating and policy-making). The Council also maps out a

collective vision for the community and establishes policies to

govern. It focuses on the community goals, major projects, and such long-term considerations as community growth, capital improvement plans, capital financing, and strategic planning.

The single most important policy document the Council works on is the annual budget. The start of a new calendar year brings with it the start of the Town's annual budget process. The process starts with Town staff submitting requests to the Town Manager. Those requests are reviewed and amended by the Manager before presenting the budget to the Town Council. The Town Council will review the Town Manager's proposed budget and work with the Manager to make amendments to the budget leading to a public hearing to get input from Clinton taxpayers. The start of the budget process begins in February with the Town Manager's Proposed Budget being presented to the Town Council by the Town Manager and the Superintendent of Schools. The public hearing on the budget will be scheduled for early April with the Budget Referendum scheduled for May.

Other exciting projects in Clinton are moving forward. A preferred developer has been awarded the re-use of the former Pierson School to convert the school into housing for senior citizens. The project is a public-private partnership with a private developer re-developing the space for housing but also providing space not only inside the building and on the grounds where the Town will still maintain a presence and have a new venue to serve as a senior center. As we move forward in 2024, there will be important milestones for this project. A special Town Meeting will be required to approve the change in ownership of the building giving the developer an option to purchasing the site. The developer will have to secure its funding sources from the State before construction can begin. The developer will also have to secure local planning and zoning approval to make the conversion of the school into housing a reality.

Finally, it has been *my honor* to serve as Clinton's first Town Manager since January 2020. I will transition out of Clinton to

serve in another community. I view public service as a noble profession, performing work that is important which influences critical community decisions addressing opportunities and challenges. The past four years have been a time for growth and improvement in Clinton where a number of important initiatives were started creating solid foundation to build from. We have been successful in securing a variety of grants, major investments in the community were possible through use of American Recovery Plan Act funds – both in local businesses, non-profits and town infrastructure, and talented new staff were hired to create real programs for senior citizens and to improve our planning and land use activities, and we came through the COVID-19 pandemic a resilient community that adapted to the changes and challenges.

# Collection of Unpaid Taxes

If you have not paid town taxes that were due July 1, 2023 OR January 1, 2024, please do so now. Please call or come in with a copy of your tax bill(s). We will give you the correct amount due. If you need to register or re-register a motor vehicle, payment of all motor vehicle taxes (connection of names on registrations requires all bills to be paid in all names) is required. Payment must be made with bank check, money order, cash or credit card in order to be cleared with the DMV to register or re-register a vehicle(s). All other motor vehicle, real estate and personal property tax bills may be paid by personal check.

**The current town budget approved by the voters requires \$51,222,641 to be raised by local taxes.**

As the tax collector, I have a legal obligation and the financial responsibility to collect this amount of said tax (\$51,222,641) on or before the 30th day of June 2024. If you are having financial difficulties, please call immediately to discuss the situation. If we are not able to answer your call, please leave a detailed message. We will get back to you as soon as we can. The office number is 860-669-9067.

**Q:** What is being done to collect delinquent taxes?

**A:** Collection of past due accounts is enforced by use of the various remedies available under the law, including withholding and / or suspension of motor vehicle registrations. Filing of tax liens; foreclosure of tax liens; sale of real property at public auction (tax sale). Levy and seizure of taxable goods and chattels, with subsequent sale and distribution; withholding, suspension or revocation of licenses or permits required in the operation of a business, including health permits; denial of building permits on tax delinquent property; and garnishment of wages. Also: Seizure of assets; seizure of bank accounts; issuance of alias tax warrants for collection by marshal or constable; initiation of suit to collect or foreclosure proceedings; and assignment of tax liens. The Clinton Tax Collector's office is sincerely committed to the efficient collection of past due taxes. Our next tax sale (public auction) will be scheduled in the Fall of 2024.

**B:** The collection agency we use is American National Recovery in Pennsylvania. If you receive a letter from them, it is not fraud, rather an attempt to collect past due taxes. Please reach out to them or us to pay this past due bill.

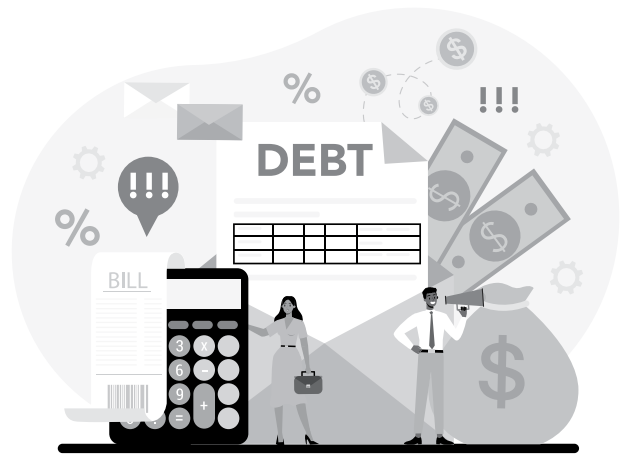

**D:** Demand notices and Intent to Lien notices will be mailed in early April. Any remaining balance by the end of the deadline given will have a lien filed or be turned over to collections.

## Clinton Land Use Office

### Where Do I Look to Find Out If I Have a Survey of My Property or If I Have a Septic As Built?

In the Land Use Office, all of our property documents have been digitized. If you are looking to see if there was a survey done on your property, or where your Septic As Built is, or if you want to know if a Zoning Permit was approved for a barn, you would first look in the Property Files.

The way to access them is to go to our website which is [www.clintonct.org](http://www.clintonct.org). On the top, right side of the page, hover over How Do I? Then, click on Find, and click on Property Files.

There are hyperlinks for both OpenGov, which is our new land use permitting system, and Treeno, which is where historic documents can be found.

This is copied directly from our Clinton webpage:

#### Property Research

Effective September 21, 2023, in order to access records in

OpenGov (Viewpoint) you are now required to create an account. (Here, you will click on the link for instructions).

To view current open applications/permits associated with a property (documents stored in OpenGov, our new permitting system) (Here, you will click on the link).

To view historical documents associated with a property (documents stored in DocuPhase/Treeno) (Here, you will click on the link).

To view documents stored with the Town Clerk's Office: (Here, you will click on the link).

Type in the property address, and you will see organizational tabs labeled Health, Building, Zoning Enforcement, Inland Wetlands, etc. The tabs will vary depending on what is applicable to that property.

Some of the PDFs will have multiple documents. At the top, you will see 1/1 for one page or 1/25 if there are 25 pages in that PDF. Some large files, such as those for commercial properties, may have multiple pages of documents, so you will click on the arrow at the bottom of the page to go to the next page.

We always recommend using a computer or tablet, not a cell phone to look up property files. If you do not have a computer, you are welcome to use the computer in the Land Use Office.

If you have any questions, please contact the Land Use Office. We are always here to help.

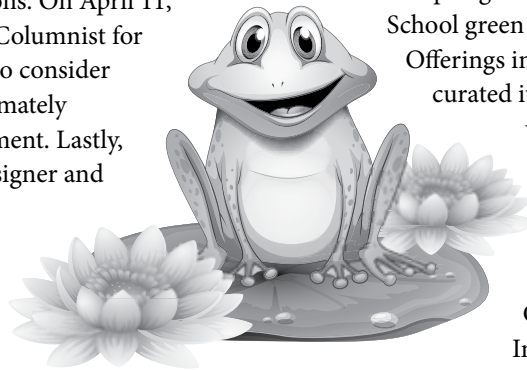

On Friday, April 26, join The Arbor Garden Club of Clinton members for our annual tree planting and dedication event. Check Facebook for planting location details.

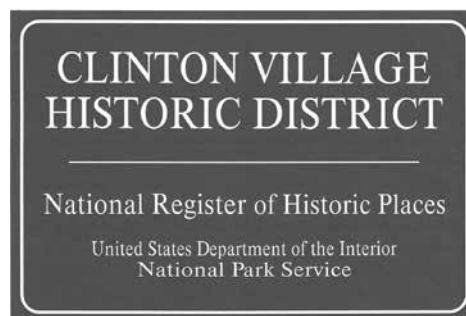

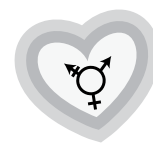
